Resident Research Paper Prizes: First (\$2,000), second (\$1,500), and third (\$1,000) place Resident Research Prizes are available in both clinical and basic science categories through the generosity of GYRUS ACMI, ENT Division. All manuscripts submitted for this competition must have a resident as senior author and must describe work that has not been placed under active consideration for publication other than in Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery. All award winning manuscripts will be automatically accepted as oral or poster presentations at the AAO-HNS Translational & Basic Research Presentations Program to be held this September in Chicago, IL and will be submitted to the Editor of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery for further review and consideration for publication in the journal; alternatively, manuscripts may be submitted to the Journal of the Association for Research in Otolaryngology. All award winners are expected to attend both the Opening Ceremony and the Research Awards Ceremony to receive their awards.

Medical Student Research Paper Prize: A single award of \$500 is available in either the basic or clinical science category. The conditions and instructions for this competition are the same as those for the Resident Research Paper Awards with the exception that the senior author of a submitted manuscript must have been a medical student at the time the research was conducted.

Since the early 1980s, GYRUS ACMI, ENT Division's generosity has resulted in over \$230,000 contributions earmarked for research programs and research prizes. The American Academy of Otolaryngology – Head and Neck Surgery is grateful to have GYRUS ACMI, ENT Division's support of our young investigators.

How to Apply for Prizes:

Submission of manuscripts and abstracts will open on February 1, 2008 and will close on February 29, 2008.

Submitting manuscript: Residents or students interested in either of these Research Paper Prizes should send an electronic copy of their manuscript to Stephanie L. Jones, Senior Manager, Research sljones@entnet.org. Historically, we have requested hard copies, however we are going paperless this year, so only send electronic copies. No applications for prizes will be considered unless an abstract is also submitted to the Translational & Basic Research Presentations Program via AMOS <http://am.abstractsmanagement.net/>.

Submitting an abstract to the Research Forum: All applications for oral and poster presentations must be submitted using AMOS <http://am.abstractsmanagement.net/>. When you proceed to the online submission form, please read the text, directions, and terms carefully. You will be asked to agree to those terms to submit your abstract. Any item marked with an asterisk (*) is required information, and must be completed.

You will receive confirmation via email when your submission is received, but this is not confirmation that your presentation has been accepted. The status of your abstract will be emailed in late May, 2008. A unique tracking number will be provided for all submissions. Please use this number in all correspondence regarding your application. Note: If you do not receive a tracking number or email confirming your submission, your application may not have been transmitted correctly. Additionally, if your mail system uses filters to block unsolicited email, please be aware that you might miss important information from the Academy and Coordinator for this program. We suggest that you modify your filters as appropriate.



NEW THIS YEAR: Each co-presenter is required to fill out their own disclosure/disclaimer information. If you enter an email address for a co-presenter, they will receive an email from the AAO-HNS that includes a unique link to AMOS. Each presenter must click on the link provided in this email in order to properly attach your presentation to their account, so that they may fill out the disclosure/disclaimer information. If they do not have an AAO-HNS account, they must create one through AMOS after clicking on the link in the email.

IMPORTANT: We strongly encourage you to have the following information available before you begin your application:

- complete name (including degree), AAO-HNS ID number (if applicable), email, a permanent address, and CME disclosure information about each author, and
- your abstract, composed and spell-checked, in a separate word processing program.

This will streamline your submission process and help ensure that you don't lose information due to system problems.
