Advocacy Win: Proposed Cuts to Medicare Physician Payments Defeated

Thanks to the quick action of our members and the advocacy efforts of the AAO-HNS and other physician groups, an <u>SGR-like proposal</u> relating to "mis-valued codes" was removed from a Congressional spending bill. If enacted, the extension of the codes would have resulted in substantial cuts to Medicare physician payments.

AAO-HNS Supports Congressional Resolution Recognizing World Hearing Day

The AAO-HNS joined others in the hearing health community to draft a <u>Congressional Resolution introduced by U.S.</u> <u>Representatives David McKinley (R-WV) and Mike Thompson (D-CA)</u>, Co-Chairs of the Congressional Hearing Health Caucus, designating March 3 as World Hearing Day. The Resolution underscores the importance of hearing loss prevention, highlights the significance of patient access to early detection and intervention, and recognizes the role otolaryngologists serve on the hearing healthcare team.

#### Advocacy Win: Anthem Rescinds Modifier 25 Reduction

Thanks to coordinated, sustained efforts by the AAO-HNS, our members, and others in the House of Medicine, <u>Anthem has rescinded its policy</u> across its entire network relating to the Modifier 25 reduction. This advocacy win for the physician community is a great example of how multiple stakeholders using complementary approaches can effect change.

#### Save the Date: FDA Sleep Devices Workshop

On April 16, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) will <u>convene a public workshop</u> at its Silver Spring, MD, campus regarding the regulation of medical devices for sleep disordered breathing. The AAO-HNS has had a significant role in the planning of the workshop and will be a major participant on the panels. Limited spots will be available to attend the workshop in person or via webinar. #### Apply Now! CMS Study on Burdens Associated with Reporting Quality Measures

Many clinicians have expressed concerns about the challenges associated with Merit-based Incentive Payment System (MIPS) reporting. In response to these concerns, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) is launching a study on the <u>Burdens Associated with Reporting Quality Measures in 2018</u>. With this study, CMS seeks to learn more about clinician workflows, increase its understanding of the challenges in data collection and quality reporting, and recommend changes to lower the reporting burden.

## **Quality Payment Program Year Two Brochure Now Available!**

The AAO-HNS has developed an <u>updated brochure</u> on the Quality Payment Program (QPP) for year two. The new brochure focuses primarily on changes to MIPS, as most AAO-HNS members will participate in the QPP via MIPS. Find out if MIPS applies to you and learn about QPP changes for 2018!

\*Contributions to ENT PAC are not deductible as charitable contributions for federal income tax purposes.
