#### Fall Legislative Agenda

Lawmakers return to Capitol Hill on Tuesday, September 5, to face a full legislative agenda. The Senate Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions (HELP) will kick things off with <u>two hearings</u> as part of a bipartisan commitment to enact meaningful healthcare reform. Other top agenda items include reauthorization of the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP), tax reform, raising the debt ceiling, and approving the budget for FY18.

## AAO-HNS Sponsors Tour of NIDCD Research Labs at NIH

As a member of the "Friends of the Congressional Hearing Health Caucus (FCHHC)," the AAO-HNS co-sponsored a tour of the <u>National Institute on Deafness and Other Communication Disorders (NIDCD)</u> at the NIH on August 24.

The tour, attended by Congressional staff and representatives from FCHHC member organizations, showcased the Center's research programs and scientific advancements.
