Responses must be submitted in writing and returned with the items noted above. *All documents must be submitted via email to a member of the Nominating Committee by the December 7 deadline to qualify.*

- Do you fully understand the job description and are you willing to serve the full term of the position? Yes, I understand the position and am willing to serve.
- Do you fully understand the time commitments for the position you are considering, and are you willing and able to meet the expected time commitments?

Yes, I am willing to commit the time needed to serve in this position.

- What experience do you have with Academy committees, board membership, or other specialty organizations that uniquely qualify you for the position for which you are being considered?
 As a founding member of the WIO governing council, I have been very involved in the formation of the WIO section and the structuring of the section. I am treasurer of the WIO, WIO Governing Council member, Chair of the Endowment Committee and immediate past chair of the Sleep Disorders Committee. As I am starting my second term on the FISC, I have current insight as to the financial strengths and challenges of the Academy.
- What experience do you have with hospital leadership, medical staff, community service, or other nonotolaryngology organizations that uniquely qualify you for the position for which you are being considered?"

During my twenty years with a multispecialty group, I served on the board of directors and was treasurer of the group. As treasurer, I led the financial oversight process for the group and served as chair of the Physician Benefits committee. This committee chose and monitored the pension plan manager and restructured the physician disability plan. During this time, I completed the Physician Leadership Training program, a 60 hour program sponsored by the University of Kentucky.

I have served two terms as Chair of Otolaryngology for St Joseph Hospital and am now the Medical Director for St Joseph Sleep Center, As Medical Director, I have considerable involvement in the management and financial decisions of the center.

Currently I also manage my own company, Otosleep.

- What is your primary motivation for considering running for this position?
 Otolaryngologists have an amazing range of practice and subspecialty options available to them;
 however, that diversity can lead to fragmentation. Given the many challenges we face in our practices,
 we must be united in working to benefit our patients and our members. I would like to help lead our
 Academy through the changes ahead with an emphasis on unity of the specialty.
- What problems, if any, do you anticipate in fulfilling the requirements for this position?
 There is a possibility that I may not be able to attend the 2015 annual meeting.
