What do you see as the essential task of the Directors and in what ways are you well suited to that role? What do you think is the most important issue that our Academy is currently facing?

Being an active duty Navy ENT for almost 14 years juxtaposed with my current rural civilian practice have together reinforced the true value and necessity of member involvement and service to the Academy. The tenet that collectively we can achieve inordinately more in advancing excellence in the delivery of care to our patients than any one of us could do individually has been aptly demonstrated in the Academy's response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Allow me to represent private practitioners and be your voice on the BOD as we work to reduce healthcare disparities in underserved communities, to continue legislative advocacy, to educate and promote lifelong learning, to increase diversity within the specialty, to promote wellness, and to engage and mentor young leaders. I have been involved in each of these areas through my roles in the SRF, on BOG committees, chairing the Barnes Society, and as the immediate past Chair of the WIO. Thank you for your vote of support.

The importance of wellness to the Academy's primary initiatives cannot be overstated. Consider overcoming the financial impact to our practices by the pandemic, office closures, the death of colleagues, loved ones and patients, exhaustion, and burnout while the guidepost to normalcy remains elusive and the stage is set. EHR inefficiencies, navigating telehealth services, the new ENM visit guidance from CMS and how these changes will affect reimbursements (anticipating a net positive but implementation will serve as the true measure), and the uncertainty of what ENT practice will become in the post-vaccine era further heighten stress and angst for many. Wellness is inextricably linked to the love that we all have for this amazing field and, therefore, must remain in the forefront for the Academy's efforts to be meaningful and impactful as we educate, lobby, mentor, innovate and lead.

Many years have passed since I completed my residency training and embarked on a satisfying, challenging and rewarding career in otolaryngology. The experience as an active duty Navy ENT for almost 14 years, providing otolaryngic care to service members and their families juxtaposed now with my position in civilian practice working in a rural community to provide care where there is an acute paucity of healthcare providers have together reinforced for me the true value and necessity of involvement and service to the American Academy of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery/Foundation by its membership. The tenet that collectively we are able to achieve inordinately more to promote and advance excellence in the delivery of care to our patients than any one of us could do individually was aptly demonstrated over the past year in the Academy's response to the COVID-19 pandemic. We have had the benefit of best practice guidance, coordination with specialty organizations within the US and around the globe to fast-track publication of pandemic-related research and safety standards, and the podcast series helping us to not only get back to work and keep our practices open through expert panel discussions from our leadership tackling the deleterious financial impact that the pandemic has had on so many across the delivery of care spectrum but also these podcasts placed each of us on the frontlines with our resident and young physician membership as graduate medical education had to pause during the initial surge earlier this year. We experienced humanity and the institute of medicine converge for the collective good and the Academy was central in disseminating the message of hope and resilience to members and nonmembers alike. I have been proud to be able to direct my colleagues and patients to the Academy website knowing that they will be accessing the most up-to-date information available on questions of practice or disease management. Being able to participate on the BOD in my role as a guest while serving as Chair of the Women in Otolaryngology section this past year allowed me to have a glimpse of how impactful our specialty organization has and will continue to be in advocating for the needs of the membership. I wish to continue to serve in a larger role by becoming a voting member of the BOD representing the private practitioners where I can be your voice as we seek to reduce the disparities of care to underserved communities, to continue legislative advocacy efforts promoting the needs of our specialty, to educate and promote lifelong learning, to increase diversity within the specialty by promotion and outreach to underrepresented minority medical students, and engage and mentor young leaders. There remains a lot of work ahead recognizing that change is the norm not the exception and I am humbled to be afforded an opportunity to be considered in this servant leader role. Thank you for your support of me in this pursuit.
