Summation of Published Works Within the Specialty:

I have over 90 published works including book chapters and over 80 peer-reviewed publications in the field of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck surgery. My work has included scholarship in surgical management of primary hyperparathyroidism, melanoma of the head and neck, multidisciplinary management of Merkel Cell Carcinoma, the role and outcomes of neck dissection in upper aerodigestive cancers and the impact of depression on outcomes of treatment of upper aerodigestive cancers.
