ALL DOCUMENTS MUST BE SUBMITTED IN ENGLISH TOGETHER AS A SINGLE PDF FILE.

- 1. Completed application form
- 2. Your curriculum vitae (short version of three pages or less)
- 3. A personal statement of 300 words or fewer, describing i) your career interests and goals, ii) the Annual Meeting & OTO EXPO events that you are interested in attending, and iii) the opportunity for an observership. Please be specific about your clinical interests and your goals for your observership, including the types of surgeries you wish to observe. Present your most compelling argument on why an IVS to attend this meeting and observership are essential to your otolaryngology-head and neck surgery training and experience
- 4. A letter from your department chair that certifies you are in good standing in your department, that the chair will allow study leave to attend the Annual Meeting & OTO EXPO plus an observership of a short period, and describes your strong qualifications for the scholarship
- 5. An official invitation letter from the U.S. otolaryngology organization, department, and/or program where you will spend your observership
- 6. Copy of your passport
- 7. Color photo (.jpg 300 DPI high resolution)
- 8. All supporting materials must be in English

The aforementioned items are mandatory.

INTERNATIONAL VISITING SCHOLARS: PURPOSE AND ELIGIBILITY

International Visiting Scholarships are for otolaryngologists from outside the United States, who have completed otolaryngology training 1) to attend the AAO-HNSF Annual Meeting & OTO EXPO and 2) to spend a short period (minimum two weeks) studying in an otolaryngology department in the U.S.

Each grant of USD \$2,000 is not expected to fully cover the expenses of attending the AAO-HNSF Annual Meeting & OTO EXPO and the observership. The grant includes a waiver for AAO-HNSF Annual Meeting & OTO EXPO registration fees and a one-year membership in the AAO-HNS. The grantee will bear all other costs.

Unless otherwise stated, all International Visiting Scholarships are for international otolaryngologists in full-time junior faculty academic positions, under 40 years of age on October 1, (OR within the first eight years of professional practice after residency or fellowship training). Some IVS grants have specific criteria regarding nationality, specialty, etc.; please read the grant descriptions carefully. In some cases, the award preference may be given to applicants from a World Bank designated low income and lower middle income country, based on Group A and Group B (see listing on next page).

The following are NOT eligible for these grants:

- Citizens of the U.S. or of countries deemed ineligible by the terms of the award
- Foreign nationals who have previously attended an AAO-HNSF Annual Meeting & OTO EXPO
- Individuals who are in residency training
- Individuals who have previously received an IVS scholarship from AAO-HNSF
