HAL FOSTER, MD  
In 1896, Dr. Hal Lovelace Foster called the  
meeting of what would later become the American  
Academy of Otolaryngology—Head and Neck  
Surgery when he invited more than 500  
ophthalmologists and otolaryngologists to  
inaugural meeting of the Western Ophthalmic  
and Otolaryngological, and Maxillofacial  
Association. By 1901, with 434 members  
the Academy had become the largest specialty  
organization in the United States. Dr. Foster estimated  
the entire first meeting cost \$400, which he paid  
from his own funds. Foster said of that meeting,  
“The money I spent in calling those people  
together was the best investment I ever made.”

# 99th Millennium Society Life Member: Dr. Byron Bailey – Decades of Leadership

It has been said, if you want to have a sense of your future, review your past. If this statement is true, the future of the Millennium Society looks bright.

If the Academy seeks to understand what drives our members to provide financial support of our specialty, consider the history and record of service, excellence, and philanthropy of one of its long time members:

**Dr. Byron Bailey**, the 99th person to join as a Life Member of the Millennium Society. This milestone was achieved through the creation of the **Byron J. Bailey, MD, and Margaret Bailey, Humanitarian Efforts Resident Travel Grant** as part of the Hal Foster, MD Endowment.

Dr. Bailey has provided longstanding financial support to the Foundation. All of his philanthropy, including this most recent leadership level gift, reflects his passion for the practice of medicine, his desire to achieve the advancement of patient care through research, and a goal to provide quality medical care and training around the globe.

Dr. Bailey's decision to be a leader in providing philanthropy to our specialty is an extension of his decades of leadership including President of AAO-HNS/F from 1988 to 1989. In recognition for his in-depth involvement with the Academy, Dr. Bailey received the Distinguished Service Award in 1998 and was the recipient of the Jerome C. Goldstein, MD Public Service Award in 1999. He has also served as president of the following organizations: American Board of Otolaryngology, American Laryngological Association, American Society of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery, Christian Society of

Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery, Galveston County Medical Society, National Association of Physicians for the Environment, Society of University Otolaryngologists, and Texas Otolaryngological Association.

It is impossible to think about international medical outreach without thinking of Dr. Bailey. The Humanitarian Efforts Committee is just one of the many Academy committees on which he served. The

beginnings of his interest in traveling the world to provide medical treatment and training all started at an AAO-HNS/F annual meeting.

As he tells it, "Jack Hough was a giant inspiration to me and the person that got me involved. Jack was approached at the 1996 Annual Meeting & OTO EXPO<sup>SM</sup> by three Vietnam OTOs who were attending the conference. At the time there were only four OTOs in that country." These doctors asked for Dr. Hough's involvement with Resource Exchange International (REI) in forming international trips for training and to

provide medical support. After 17 years of providing such humanitarian aid, Dr. Bailey recently received a call from the current leader of REI who had just returned from Vietnam to share updates from his trip. The continuing success of this endeavor says Dr. Bailey, "is the icing on the cake."

In addition to Vietnam, Dr. Bailey has also devoted years to the improved care and training of healthcare professionals in the specialty in Cuba. Does he think he has influenced others in the specialty to participate in humanitarian efforts? Dr. Bailey replies modestly that his approach is simply "to invite them to join in this effort" and that he has seen that "the work is so satisfying that it is the work itself that inspires them to continue to be involved."

A native son of Oklahoma, Dr. Bailey began his medical career in at UCLA where he completed his residency and rose to the role as Chief of Ear Nose and Throat with the UCLA/Harbor Hospital (1964-1968). He transitioned to The University of Texas Medical Branch in Galveston, TX as the Weiss Professor and Chairman of the Department of Otolaryngology (1968-2004). The Byron Bailey Surgical Society was established in recognition of his decades of leadership. Dr. Bailey describes with satisfaction the

pate in educational and leadership meetings;


- High-quality knowledge and education resources for otolaryngologists and their staff;

work of the society, which includes delivering professional education and conducting a capstone program for residents including an achievement recognition forum.

So many have benefitted from Dr. Bailey's dedication to the specialty. Recognition for this long record of service includes: the DeRoaldes Medal and the James E.
